In this regard, Professor (Mrs) I.A. Fuwape of the Department of Physics was appointed Dean of the School of Sciences, Professor D.O. Adefolalu as Ag. Dean, School of Earth and Mineral Sciences, while Professor J.O. Afolayan, Professor J.A. Alokun and Professor D.R. Ogunsemi have been re-appointed Dean of the School of Engineering and Engineering Technology, School of Agriculture and Agricultural Technology and School of Environmental Technology, respectively.

VC ATTRIBUTES SUCCESS TO STAFF'S COOPERATION

The Vice-Chancellor of the Federal University of Technology, Akure, Professor Adebisi Balogun has expressed appreciation to Deans of Schools, Directors and Heads of Departments and Units for their support for his administration and the general development of the University.

Professor Balogun, while speaking at a dinner organized for the outgoing and the newly –elected Deans, Directors, Heads of Departments and Units, informed that the advance level the University has reached in recent time is a reflection of their commitment and dedication to the cause of the University.

He said that the quest to see FUTA compete in the premiership race with first generation Universities is a collective responsibility which all must embrace and support.

According to him, leaders at all levels should demonstrate good moral, character and personality worthy of emulation by the followers.

The Vice-Chancellor, who described the Deans, Directors, Heads of Departments and Units as elderstatesmen, reminded them that the responsibility of developing their schools, Departments and Units rests solely on them.

Professor Balogun, however, revealed that the process of appointing his successor will be carried out by a statutory committee which will be constituted by the appropriate authority very soon.

Earlier in his admonition, FUTA STEP-B Project Manager, Professor Olugboyega Ademosun had charged the newly Deans, Directors and Heads of Departments and Units to support the aspirations of the Vice-Chancellor.

The STEP-B Manager emphasized that leaders at all levels in the University should operate with the fear of God and charged them to give their best irrespective of challenges facing them in the process, quoting proverb chapter 10 verse four.

He said that people in position of authority should demonstrate great level of commitment, competence, character and conviction, which according to him, will expose them to God's favour and accord them respect in the sights of their followers.

Professor Ademosun reiterated that the Institution has created goodwill for itself which he said is evident in the preference of the university by parents and students over the first generation Universities.

He commended the Vice-Chancellor for his vision for the University, saying the institution has witnessed tremendous development during his term as Vice-Chancellor.

Highlight of the occasion was the presentation of gifts to the outgoing Deans, Directors and Heads of Departments for their outstanding performance and support for the University.

VC CHALLENGES STAKEHOLDERS IN EDUCATION

Stakeholders in the education sector at national, state and local levels have been enjoined to rise to the degradation in the country's education system.

The Vice-Chancellor of the University, Professor Adebisi Balogun, who made the call during his inspection of the Post Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination (UTME) of the institution, expressed concern at the way education is handled in the country.

He said that the smooth conduct of the computer-based screening is an improvement on the earlier editions of the exercise which he said was achieved through evaluation. Prof. Balogun, who recalled that the candidates for the exercise were over 17,500 as against the 10,500 last year, added that the University is currently building a digital centre that will assist in future exercise.

Also speaking, the University Admission Committee Chairman and Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Academic), Professor Debo Adeyewa stated that the exercise was a success despite the initial challenges faced in controlling the crowd.

Prof. Adeyewa who said that efforts were geared towards ensuring an improved screening, maintained that members of the committee worked as a team to achieve the goal of being the University with the best electronic examination.

He explained that the exercise was divided into seven stages which include screening of candidates, checking of slips, stamping of UTME forms, orientation, biometrics, demonstration and electronic screening which is the point of examination.

According to him, the computer system is programmed with different questions for each candidate in a way that will make cheating impossible for them.

Candidates at the exercise conducted themselves very well and expressed their satisfaction on the quality of facilities, the arrangement and the supervision.

FORMER NUC CHIEF ADVOCATES REVIEW OF PROFESSORIAL APPOINTMENT PROCESS

Former Executive Secretary, National Universities Commission (NUC), Professor Peter Okebukola has called for a review of the process of appointing professors in Nigerian Universities.

Professor Okebukola, who made the call during a courtesy call on the Vice-Chancellor of the Federal University of Technology, Akure, Professor Adebisi Balogun, said it is through an improved professorial appointment process that professors from the country can compete with those from other countries of the world.

The Don maintained that appointment of professors should be based on merit and not on other considerations, adding that unmerited professors will contribute nothing to the quality of graduates.

He also advocated for a merit selection process for the Post Unified Tertiary Matriculation Examination candidates who are jostling for the limited spaces in the Nigerian higher institutions of learning.

Prof. Okebukola commended the management of FUTA for the physical and academic development of the University, and urged the Management team to maintain the excellent standard set by the founding fathers of the University.

In his response, the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Adebisi Balogun who described Professor Okebukola's comments as a wake-up call, appreciated him for his passion for FUTA since his days as the Executive Secretary of the National Universities Commission.

He informed that the University has improved the process of appointing professors as research work of nominees always pass through external and local assessors for proper examination and scrutiny.

The Vice-Chancellor reiterated that FUTA will always go for the best when it comes to the admission of students in order to ensure a continuous academic standard.

Professor Balogun emphasized that the institution will soon complete a 2,500 capacity digital centre and two hostels of 500 capacity each to improve the standard of living of the students.

OGUNSEMI BECOMES CHAIRMAN, COMMITTEE OF DEANS

The Dean, School of Environmental Technology, Professor D.R. Ogunsemi has been elected Chairman, Committee of Deans.

His election is for a period of one year with effect from August, 2011.

BRAZILIAN VARSITY PARTNERS FUTA ON SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH

The Federal University of Santa Maria, Brazil is set to collaborate with the Federal University of Technology, Akure, in the area of scientific research and innovation.

Professor J. B. T. Rocha of the Brazilian University, during a courtesy call on the Vice-Chancellor of FUTA, Professor Adebisi Balogun, said that the University deserved such collaboration as it had demonstrated a great zeal for scientific research, which according to him is evident in the various researches that members of staff of FUTA had conducted in Brazil.

Professor Rocha revealed that there has been a cordial relationship between the Federal University of Santa Maria, Brazil and some FUTA staff in the School of Science who he said had come to conduct researches in the Brazilian University's laboratories.

The Brazilian Don, while commending the University for its various research efforts, appreciated the reception given him and his partner, Professor (Mrs) Maria Rosa since their arrival in the University.

Responding, the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Adebisi Balogun described as motivating, the accolades rained on the University by the Brazilian.

Prof. Balogun informed that the University is ready to partner the Brazilian Institution in order to foster scientific and technological research that will help the two countries.

The Vice-Chancellor who recalled that Nigeria and Brazil share a similar culture, affirmed that FUTA has already established a profiting relationship with University of Libra and Sao Paolo University, both in Brazil.

He stated that FUTA is presently using the post graduate research laboratory for its research activities and promised that the Central Research Laboratory will soon be completed.

BRAZILIAN DON ADVOCATES ADVANCE BIOLOGY STUDY

A Brazilian Don, Professor Batista Rocha of the Federal University of Santa Moria, Brazil has suggested advance study of biology in Nigerian Higher Institutions, as a way of ensuring healthy living.

Professor Rocha, who was on a visit to the Federal University of Technology, Akure to foster collaboration on scientific research with the Brazilian University, said FUTA has demonstrated great concern about the health condition of the country by sending members of its staff to Brazil for research.

Speaking on the topic: "Organoselenium Compounds: Toxicology and Pharmacology", the Brazilian Professor reiterated the need for extensive study on selenium to know its advantages over its disadvantages.

Professor Rocha who admitted that Nigeria is blessed with herbs that can cure diseases, warned against taking food with excess selenium that has harmful effects on the body system.

He recommended that Nigeria should conduct research on its soil and water to ascertain the level of selenium they contain, adding that a database should also be put in place to manage the findings.

The Don informed that strong odour from the mouth is a symptom of selenium infections.

SOS ACQUIRES 16-SEATER HIACE BUS

The School of Science recently acquired a brand new 16 seater Hiace bus for domestic use in the school.

The School's new treasure was acquired through its endowment fund alongside supplementary financial support from the University Management.

The bus was specifically acquired as a utility vehicle for Conference attendance, field trips, group academic researches and other research related activities.
